The Centre was inaugurated on July 3, 2024 by Inspector General of Police, Bangladesh, Mr. Chowdhury Abdullah Al-Mamun, BPM (Bar), PPM. The event began with a presentation by Mr. Md. Golam Rasul, MDS (Academic) of the college, who outlined the aims, objectives, and working areas of the center. The presentation highlighted the center's potential to advance research and innovation within the Bangladesh Police, in collaboration with the international research community. IPRIC aims to promote science and technology-based public safety by fostering collaborative relationships between researchers, academics, and police personnel.

In his speech, the Chief Guest described the establishment of IPRIC as a timely initiative in the current global context. He emphasized that innovation and research are essential to addressing contemporary policing challenges. He expressed optimism that the center would play a crucial role in integrating modern research with field-level policing, thereby enhancing the effectiveness of the Bangladesh Police.

Dr. Mallick Faqrul Islam, BPM, PPM, Rector of PSC, remarked that the establishment of IPRIC marks the beginning of an international research institute dedicated to facilitating research, innovation, and technology in policing both in Bangladesh and globally. He noted that the Police Staff College Bangladesh is already collaborating with various domestic and international institutions, and the establishment of IPRIC has opened new avenues for cooperation and coordination. The event was attended by additional IGP's of Bangladesh Police, teachers and researchers from various universities, and development officers from various units of the Bangladesh Police.

IPRIC's areas of research include the following:

- Smart Policing & Contemporary Policing Practices
- Artificial Intelligence and Advanced Technology
- Juvenile delinquency and gang culture
- ICT, social media, cybercrime and cyber security
- Community policing & beat policing
- Innovation and global best practices in police work
- Mega Project Security & its impact on socio-economic development
- Financial crime & future crime analysis
- Human trafficking, arms trafficking and other Transnational crime
- Environmental crime and protection of wildlife

One of the key work areas of the Centre is to promote creative and innovative solutions to facilitate cutting-edge training and research. By bringing together experts from a wide range of backgrounds, IPRIC will develop contemporary, creative solutions to challenges in policing and preparing police to fight against technology-enabled threats. It will also facilitate leadership development process and connect law enforcement, academia and private sector partners to exchange knowledge and explore new technologies and emerging threats.

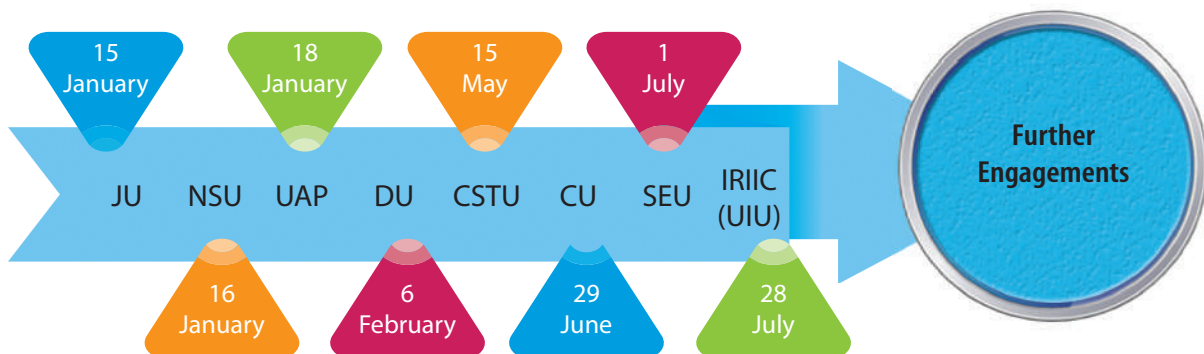

PSC Signs MoUs with Renowned Educational Institutions



PSC's Engagement with Educational Institutions (January- August 2024)

Police Staff College Bangladesh has signed a series of Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with several renowned educational institutions throughout 2024, aiming to enhance collaboration in research, training, and development. MoUs were signed with Jahangirnagar University (JU) on 15 January, North-South University (NSU) on 16 January, and the University of Asia Pacific (UAP) on 18 January.

The collaboration continued with Dhaka University (DU) on 6 February, Chandpur Science and Technology University (CSTU) on 15 May, and Chittagong University (CU) on 29 June. An MoU was signed with South East University on 1 July. The MoUs stand testament to PSC's striving for cooperation and collaboration with educational institutes and reputed research organizations.

Post Graduate Diploma in Cyber Security begins at PSC

The inauguration ceremony of the first batch of the Postgraduate Diploma (PGD) in Cybersecurity Course took place at Police Staff College Bangladesh on March 23, 2024. This course is designed to emphasize the importance of building a smart police force, aligning with national directives aimed at enhancing law enforcement capabilities in a rapidly advancing technological landscape. It represents a significant step toward the government's vision of a prosperous and technologically advanced nation. By equipping officers with the necessary skills in cybersecurity, this initiative aims to develop a highly skilled workforce, essential for addressing the challenges of the future.

The PGD course aims to develop police officers capable of managing cybercrime by equipping them with essential knowledge and skills in cybersecurity. He mentioned that the course is designed to foster an effective partnership between the police force and society in ensuring the cybersecurity of a smart economy. Officers from the rank of Police Inspector to DIG are participating in the course.

The respected guests emphasized the vital role this PGD course can play in addressing the challenges of cybersecurity in the modern era. He praised the course's focus on practical skills, noting that it will empower Bangladesh Police personnel to face future challenges effectively. They remarked that this PGD course represents a significant step toward building a smart police force in a smart Bangladesh and commended the timeliness of the course in the current context.

Dr. Mallick Faqrul Islam, BPM, PPM, Rector of Police Staff College Bangladesh, added that the Postgraduate Diploma in Cybersecurity is part of the government's broader vision to build a digitally-enabled Bangladesh. He said that PSC is committed to enhancing the capabilities of Bangladesh Police to prepare for the upcoming challenges of the digital world and beyond. The inauguration of new PGD programs, including on Security Management, is also in the pipeline to bolster efforts in this regard. The Rector thanked the Academic Branch of the College, the Ministry of Home Affairs, Police Headquarters, and National University authorities for their support in launching the course.

Master of Applied Criminology and Police Management: 8th batch commences class

The “Master of Applied Criminology and Police Management” (MACPM) at Police Staff College Bangladesh, continues to advance with the inauguration of its 8th batch on 17 February 2024. This one-year Master’s program, conducted under the National University, commenced in the academic year 2015-2016. It is designed to enhance professional knowledge and skills in crime management. Alongside police officers, it is also open to individuals from other professions, including military officers, civil servants, lawyers, teachers, and development workers.

Superintendents of Police receive training on executive management

The **3rd Police Executive Management Certificate Course (PEMCC)** at Police Staff College Bangladesh, conducted from 31 March to 02 May 2024, covered a wide range of topics essential for senior police officers, particularly Superintendents of Police (SPs). The course focused on enhancing leadership skills in the context of law enforcement and public administration.

Participants were evaluated on their understanding of challenges in implementing the Strategic Plan of Bangladesh Police and their roles in the National Integrity Strategy (NIS). The course also emphasized the importance of addressing human rights issues, environmental policing, and the application of the DSB Manual. Additionally, participants explored the relevance of an internal audit system within the police



force, the complexities of cybercrime prevention, and the critical roles of police leaders in negotiation and conflict management. To ensure a comprehensive grasp of these areas, participants were also required to demonstrate their understanding of key management tools such as SWOT Analysis and various procedural frameworks like DPP, TPP, APA, and E-tendering processes.

The 8th **General and Financial Management Certificate Course (GAFMCC)** organized by Police Staff College Bangladesh took place from March 18, 2024, to May 2, 2024. This course was specifically designed for officers at the rank of Additional Superintendent of Police (Addl. SP), with a total of 21 participants. The program focused on developing the administrative and financial management skills of the officers, covering

areas such as strategic planning, budgeting, resource management, and ethical leadership, essential for effective command and decision-making in law enforcement.

The course focused on equipping police officers with essential knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary for effective leadership and management. The course covered a wide range of topics, including strategic planning, budgeting, financial management, procurement procedures, and legal frameworks. Participants were trained in decision-making, problem-solving, and analytical skills to enhance their capabilities in managing resources and personnel effectively. The course also emphasized the importance of ethical behavior, integrity, and professionalism, fostering a positive attitude toward public service and the responsibilities of police leadership. Through interactive sessions, case studies, and practical exercises, the course aimed to develop well-rounded leaders who can navigate complex administrative and financial challenges while upholding the core values of the police force.

Two batches of ASPs graduate successfully in PSC course

The **6th Police Leadership and Management Certificate Course**, held from January 28 to March 14, 2024, and the **7th Police Leadership and Management Certificate Course**, conducted from July 14 to August 29, 2024, each saw the successful graduation of 19 participants. These courses were designed to enhance the leadership capabilities of police officers, focusing on strategic management, decision-making, and effective communication within law enforcement. Both batches completed the rigorous training, equipping them with the necessary skills and knowledge to excel in their leadership roles within the police force.

Both the graduating batches were comprised of participants from the 35th BCS (Police) batch. The participants were from District Police, Metropolitan Police, training centers and specialized units of Bangladesh Police. The Police Leadership and Management Certificate Course (PLMCC) is structured over a 7-week period, designed to comprehensively develop the leadership skills of Assistant Superintendents of Police. The course begins with 3 weeks of in-person, offline training at Police Staff College Bangladesh. This is followed by 3 weeks of online training and field attachment while stationed at their respective units. After completing these sessions, participants return to PSC with a final week dedicated to feedback and reflection on the learning experience. This blended approach ensures that officers not only gain theoretical knowledge but also practical exposure and diverse perspectives.

Course on Smart Policing advances to 4th batch

The Smart Policing Courses for Police Inspectors at the Police Staff College Bangladesh have been instrumental in equipping officers with the knowledge and skills needed to adapt to modern policing challenges. The 2nd Course on Smart Policing for Police Inspectors, held from April 21 to May 2, 2024, had 59 participants and focused on integrating technology and data-driven strategies into policing practices. Following this, the 3rd Course on Smart Policing for Inspectors, conducted online from May 26 to June 6, 2024, saw a significant increase in participation, with 85 inspectors of different police units attending from all around Bangladesh.

This course continued to build on smart policing principles, emphasizing remote learning and digital collaboration. The 4th Course on Smart Policing for Inspectors, also conducted online from July 7 to July 18, 2024, had 60 participants, further reinforcing the application of smart policing techniques in the field. These courses collectively enhanced the participants' abilities to implement innovative policing strategies in their respective areas.

Coordinated by PSC, the ASP (Probationers) attended orientation courses conducted by major units of Bangladesh Police. The newly joined ASP (Probationers) from the 41st BCS (Police) batch are hosted at PSC from 8 May to 15th September 2024. This period included various foundational and skill development modules designed to prepare them for their roles in law enforcement. In the initial weeks, participants were oriented to the Police Staff College Bangladesh and introduced to key concepts such as the mission, vision, and strategic plan of Bangladesh Police. Sessions on human rights, interdepartmental relationships, and stress management, gender-sensitive policing, and the use of intelligence in police operations, provided a comprehensive foundation for the probationers' future roles in law enforcement.

The 1st Induction Course for Newly Promoted ASPs was conducted from May 12 to May 23, 2024, organized by the Police Staff College Bangladesh. This course was specifically designed for 32 ASPs who were recently promoted from the post of Inspector, bringing with them extensive experience in their police careers. The training focused on the exchange of experiences among participants, enhancing their leadership skills, and preparing them for their new roles with a blend of practical knowledge and advanced leadership strategies. The course emphasized the importance of leveraging their past experiences while adapting to the responsibilities of an ASP.

Short course on Intelligence Analysis

The Intelligence Analysis course, held from 20th to 28th February 2024, was designed to enhance the analytical skills of police officers from various units of the Bangladesh Police. A total of 21 participants, including 1 Superintendent of Police (SP), 5 Additional Superintendents of Police (Addl. SP), and 15 Assistant Superintendents of Police (ASP), took part in this intensive training. The course aimed to equip these officers with advanced techniques in intelligence gathering and analysis, which are crucial for effective law enforcement and crime prevention in today's complex security environment.

Overseas Training

The Foundational Counter Weapons of Mass Destruction Terrorism (CWMDT) Investigations Workshop

The “Foundational Counter Weapons of Mass Destruction Terrorism (CWMDT) Investigations” workshop was held from February 11 to 15, 2024. This workshop was organized by the US Department of State’s Office of WMD Program, in collaboration with the US Embassy in Dhaka. The program focused on equipping law enforcement officials with the skills and knowledge necessary to investigate and counter threats related to weapons of mass destruction (WMD) terrorism. Participants were trained on the foundational aspects of WMD terrorism, including detection, response, and investigative techniques, with the goal of enhancing their capabilities to manage such threats effectively.

INTERPOL Policing Capabilities Programme (IPCP)

The INTERPOL Policing Capabilities Programme was conducted from March 4 to 7, 2024, organized by INTERPOL in collaboration with the National Central Bureau (NCB) at the Police Headquarters in Dhaka. This program aimed to enhance the policing capabilities of participants by providing them with the tools and knowledge necessary to engage effectively with INTERPOL’s global network. The training covered key areas such as international cooperation, the use of INTERPOL’s databases, and best practices for cross-border law enforcement, helping to strengthen the participants’ ability to tackle transnational crime.

INTERPOL also organized the “Soteria Border Management Training & Field Operation” from the 4th to the 7th of March. This training focused on enhancing border security and management through practical field operations. Participants were trained in advanced techniques for detecting and preventing cross-border crimes, utilizing INTERPOL’s resources, and implementing effective border management strategies. The program aimed to strengthen the capacity of law enforcement personnel in managing border security challenges, ensuring a coordinated and effective response to transnational threats.

The IPCP and Soteria Border Management Training & Field Operation programmes were simultaneously held at the College. Bangladesh Police personnel received the trainings under close supervision of NCB, PHQ and INTERPOL. These programmes aided the journey of capacity enhancement of our police in order to have effective roles in the global law enforcement mission for a safer and more secure world.

Workshops

UNDP's Strategy Consultation to Combat Cyber Violence Against Women

On 10 March 2024, a draft strategy consultation was held at the Police Staff College in Dhaka to discuss the "Institutional and Professional Skill Development Strategy for Police Officials to Combat Cyber Violence Against Women." This important session focused on developing and enhancing the skills of police officials to effectively address and combat the growing threat of cyber violence targeting women. The consultation was organized by the Police Staff College Bangladesh in collaboration with UNDP, bringing together experts and stakeholders to contribute to a comprehensive strategy aimed at tackling this critical issue. The discussion included the need for specialized training, understanding the complexities of cybercrime, and gender-sensitive approaches to handling cases of cyber violence.

The Workshop on “Smart Bangladesh Design Lab (SDL) (Smart Planning of Police Staff College Bangladesh in Line with Vision 2041)” was held from 25 June 2024 to 27 June 2024. This event was a joint venture involving the Police Staff College Bangladesh, the Cabinet Division, the ICT Division, and the UNDP. It built upon the proceedings of an earlier workshop held at PSC in May.

The opening ceremony on 25 June was graced by Dr. Mallick Faqrul Islam BPM PPM, Rector of Police Staff College Bangladesh, as the chief guest. Distinguished special guests included Professor Dr. Syed Ferhat Anwar from the University of Dhaka, Professor Dr. Md. Nurul Amin from Jahangirnagar University, and A.K. Sabbir Mahbub, a Digital Transformation Specialist from the ICT Division. Mr. SM Aktaruzzaman, SDS (A&R) of Police Staff College Bangladesh, presided over the ceremony.

The workshop saw participation from members of various units of Bangladesh Police, along with academicians and experts from a2i and other government institutions. This diverse group contributed to a rich exchange of ideas and perspectives on smart planning aligned with Vision 2041. The workshop identified 29 Digital Systems to work with regarding PSC’s organizational mandate. It identified 16 strategic goals under four initiatives and proposed a roadmap of the implementation strategy.

Location of Campus

The PSC campus sprawls across 19.5 acres of land adjacent to Shahid Police Smrity School & College and POM (Public Order Management) on the Mirpur Road at Mirpur-14, Dhaka. It is located between Mirpur Circle 10 and Dhaka Cantonment. With its open fields, tranquil waterbody and well-kept premises, the PSC campus is a pleasantly scenic location in the heart of Dhaka metropolis. It offers an oasis of refreshing comfort and a soothing breathing space amidst the hustle and bustle of the capital.





Police Staff College Bangladesh began its formal journey in 2000 with the vision "To Maximize Human Welfare through Quality Policing." In 1998, the idea of a separate police training and research institute was floated and within a few years, the idea was implemented. The Police Staff College Act was enacted in 2002, and since then, it has been governed by a Board of Governors chaired by the Honorable Home Minister. PSC works under the umbrella of Ministry of Home Affairs. The Rector is the chief executive of the institution.

Police Staff College Bangladesh conduct courses for participants, in particular senior police officers, to raise awareness about new ideas, thinking, perception, insight and vision in response to changing needs of the society. The institute endeavors to improve managerial capability, enhance operational performance, upgrade leadership skills and critical thinking of the participants, in the context of the national and international scenario.

PSC offers academic degrees and is working in the sectors of education and research. In July 2016, PSC introduced its first ever professional Masters course titled "Master of Applied Criminology and Police Management". A set of dedicated staff members of PSC are engaged in pursuing its academic endeavors and conducting in-depth research across a range of social, criminological, security, counter-terrorism and other policing issues.
