Dr. Benazir Ahmed, BPM (BAR) was born in 1963 in a respectable family in Gopalganj, Bangladesh. He is highly exceedingly educated person. Apart from MA, MBA and LLB, he has completed his Doctorate in Business Administration from the Faculty of "Business Studies" in the University of Dhaka.

Dr. Benazir joined Bangladesh Police Service as Assistant Superintendent of Police in February 1988. He has served in various capacities of Bangladesh Police where he proved his professionalism, dedication and excellence. Throughout his professional endeavor, he has served as Superintendent of Police in various districts, Deputy Police Commissioner North, Dhaka Metropolitan Police, Assistant Inspector General of Police, Police Headquarters; Deputy Inspector General (Finance) and Deputy Inspector General (Admin & Ops), Police Headquarters, Police Commissioner, Dhaka Metropolitan Police. Moreover, he also had the opportunity to serve as Chief Instructor in Bangladesh Police Academy, Sardah and as Commandant of Police Training Center, Tangail.

Dr. Benazir has served in the UN Mission in Bosnia (UNMIBH) and UN Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK) where he served as the Contingent Commander, Bangladesh Police Contingent. He also worked as the Chief



of “Mission Management & Support Section”, Police Division, Department of Peace Keeping Operations, United Nations Headquarters, New York, U.S.A and as the OIC of the Police Division of UNDPKO. Dr. Benazir served as Director General, Rapid Action Battalion forces, the elite force of Bangladesh Police from January 2015 to 14 April 2020.

He has ornamented and flourished himself with various professional training from home and abroad, out of which the mentionable are: Comprehensive Security Response to terrorism, Asia Pacific Center for Security Studies, Hawaii, United States of America; Intelligence Analysis & Assessment, Charles Strut University, Canberra, Australia in association with Australian Crime Commission & Australian Federal Police, Anti Money Laundering & Financing of Terrorism, IMF Regional Training Center; Singapore, HR Management, UN Training Center New York, USA. He also attended a number of Seminars and Workshops relating to Law Enforcement Issues in different countries around the world.



He has profound skills in a mastery of and specialization on different arenas of policing like Terrorism & Terror financing, Intelligence, Organizational Reform, Rebuilding, and Restructuring & Change Management. The UN appointed him as an Expert member in a Global Level “Independent Panel” to review the UN Police Division (December 2015- May 2016).

All the 23 participants, 2 faculty members and 1 representative from PHQ went to Australia for one week foreign training from 22/2/2020 to 28/2/2020.

The program at a glance :

Program title: Counter Terrorism and Countering Violent Extremism Professional Development Program for Bangladesh Police,

Expertise: Department of Security Studies and Criminology, Macquarie University Australia

Program leader: Dr. Julian Droogan, Sr. Lecturer, Countering Violent Extremism Expert, Department of Security Studies and Criminology (DSSC), Macquarie University, Sydney, Australia.

The course design :

The program design was outstanding and tailor-made. The fellows were highly satisfied with every part of its activities. It was designed in two-way communications modality for exchanging the information and best practices between each.

The course content: The course covers the following areas:

1. General Understanding of CT and CVE,
2. CT Policing in Australia,
3. Violent Extremism in Diverse Communities- Causes & Trends and Experience to Work with Communities,
4. Cyber Terrorism and its Criminal Justice Approaches,
5. Policing of Terrorism,
6. The Dark Net and Cryptography,
7. Terrorism Financing & Financial Tracking,
8. Legal Approaches of CT from International and Australian perspective,
9. Violent Extremism in relation to Religion and Radicalization,
10. De-radicalization and its Relation to Police and Prison,
11. Australian Federal Police strategy on CT/ CVE,
12. Private Sectors on the efforts of CT/CVE,
13. Australian Border Security in Relation to CT,
14. Intelligence Coordination in terms of CT/CVE,
15. Police ethics and CT and
16. Finally some thoughts on the Future of Terrorism.

Besides, the fellows had group activities to work comparative analysis between Australia and Bangladesh on CT/CVE areas. For this, they were divided into three groups at the commencement of the program to work under particular area on the contemporary CT issues of Bangladesh which they presented at the end after being familiar with the Australian as well as global aspect.

They also had some important field visits for professional learning such as NSW Police Operation Centre and NSW Water Police to understand field level police operation system in NSW, Sydney Opera House to understand the security management of one of the Key Point Installations of Australia and the Australian Institute of Police Management (AIPM) -the apex police training institute in Australia.

Mid-career course :

1st Police Leadership and Management Certificate Course

Police Officers of the rank of ASP from 33rd BCS (Police) batch joined this 08(eight)weeks long course for the first time from 12 January to 05 March 2020. Mr. SK Md. Maruf Hasan bpm, ppm, Rector, Police Staff College Bangladesh inaugurated the programme. After completion of 07 (seven) weeks, Officers will attend a foreign exposure for one week as part of enhancing professional skill & knowledge.

PLMCC Course Module :

There are total 13 modules for the course of ASP, out of which 11 modules are subjects based , the 12th module is the Term Paper Presentation and the 13th module involves field trip and visit.

Learning Objectives for PLMCC (ASP):

- Develop present & future leadership in policing.
- Provide wisdom to enforce managerial capability, operational and commanding skill
- Understand the important components of criminal justice administration system.
- Understand the effective inspection and supervision techniques

Expected Outcomes :

- Critically examine the leadership behaviors and managerial skills required to mobilize others to achieve organizational outcomes • Acquire a strong mental capability to face the challenges in the different arena of the profession like disaster management, public order management or even stress management.
- Analyze the plan for complex management problems
- Broaden their knowledge on executive level decisions, particularly in the areas of policy, human resource management and public accountability.

Partnership courses :

Identification and Seizer of Digital Evidence

This was a Partnership course with Regional Security Office, US Embassy. Duration of the course was from 12/01/20 to 16/1/20 and 19/1/20 to 23/01/20. Rank of the participants were Sub Inspector to Addl. SP. Total numbers of the participants were 25.

The training on Identification and seizer of Digital Evidence entitled digital evidence investigations, identifies how terrorist and criminals use technology to engage in criminal activity. It also identifies types of evidence that indicates the use of technology in criminal activity, and extrapolation and analysis of digital evidence obtained from computers and other electronic devices, including cellphones, GPS units, and tablets. It also provides hands on training with forensic analysis tools, discusses how to collect, identify, and protect volatile data using various tools and programs.

Main Objectives of the Course

- To have knowledge on set up equipment and configure equipment.
- To be acquainted with Digital Forensic process and crime scene processing.
- Discuss hardware and software consideration for a digital incident response toolkit
- Determined the extraction method to collect digital evidence.
- To enhance knowledge about the Safeguard Digital Integrity
- To be acquainted with modern technology based records management.

Learning Outcomes :

The course contributes to the development of key skills and capabilities of the participants. In this course their learning will be extended for;

1. Are able to create a digital incident response toolkit.
2. Can develop and use computers and other electronic devices, including cellphones, GPS units, and tablets for the investigation.
3. Have practiced on Operating Systems and Software
4. Can use various tools and programs to collect volatile digital data
5. Can effectively use multiple digital forensic platforms to solve simulated challenges.

Objective of this course:

Objective is to provide a theoretical and practical framework for considering training personal from the CTTCU Special Action Group (SAG) across three key areas. These areas will be Close Quarter Battle (CQB), Advanced medical training and Counter Improvised Explosive Device (C-IED) Ground sign Awareness(GSA). the detail of the package areas are as follows;

- 1) Close Quarter Battle-CQB. A thorough test and assurance tactical evaluations will be conducted to assess the SAG SWATs CQB,
- 2) Advanced medical. A one week medical assessment phase will be carried out for all SAG personal. And
- 3) Counter - IED Ground Sign Awareness. This part of the package will look to enhance SWAT member's abilities to Understand GSA within an urban environment
- 4) UK, CT Police Insight Awareness. UK CT Police officer conducted a lesson identified workshop with all participants.

Expected outcome:

After the successful completion of the course, the participants will be able to achieve:

- Better ability in handling of managing conflicts of interest and utilizing best practices in cases.
- Better understanding of international cooperation and fight against counter terrorism.
- Increased ability to conducting proactive investigations in counter terrorism
- increased knowledge on Counter-IED Ground Sign Awareness
